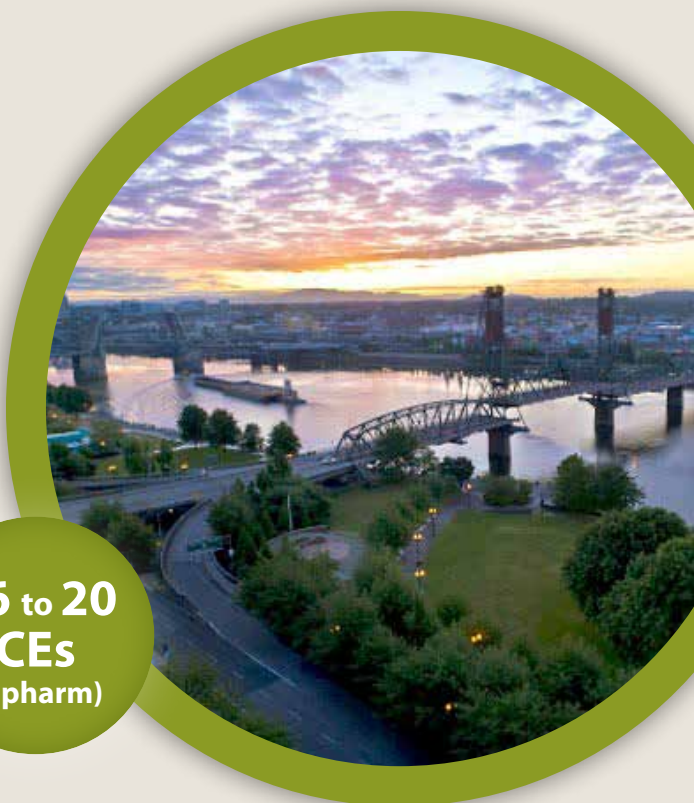

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JONATHAN KLINE, CRNA

Jonathan Kline has been an active clinician specializing in regional anesthesia and by extension, ultrasound guidance since finishing his masters in nurse anesthesia from the university of Alabama in 2003. He developed a regional and ultrasound teaching program through Twin Oaks Anesthesia that actively exposes CRNAs to these techniques, which is offered across the country. He remains active in teaching as well continuing to add to the multiple peer reviewed publications, mostly on ultrasound guided regional techniques.
